

I would love to come to you this month with a lovely and celebratory reflection on Easter and the joy of resurrection. But I'll be honest, I'm feeling a bit overwhelmed! Matthew 6:34 reads, "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today." I think this scripture is meant to encourage us and keep us from spending too much time anxious about the future. April 16th: Regular Worship **April 23rd:** Regular Worship **April 30th:** Regular Worship



Leadership Updates



NEWS...

This report includes business conducted at the February PNEC Executive Committee session and the Board of Directors meeting held in Mid-March.

The Treasurer reported that total revenue for 2022 came in at 106% of that figure in 2021, being augmented by some assets of a dissolved church and bequests. Unfortunately, this was offset by investment losses of about \$57,000. The 2023 financial reports as of February 28th showed the usual slow start after the boost that comes at the end of the previous year. Still, the total revenue to date was only about \$225 behind the amount budgeted. Total expenses are higher than this point in 2022 by about 15% due to a combination of the expense of the Conference Minister's sabbatical and increased utility costs. The Conference is committed to having an audit review of the books done this calendar year and some funds were included in the budget to cover the expense, but the treasurer is seeking a volunteer(s) to assist in the process so not all those funds will need to be used. Conference program updates (which we help support through OCWM):

- The combined Disaster Ministries Team (PNEC+PSEC) gathered and packaged 110 "clean-up" buckets to be sent to Church World Services to aid those impacted by destructive weather events, etc.
- •Amigos de Guatemala is now using the community center which so many PNEC churches supported, and they hope to send a medical team down in early 2024 to hold a clinic.
- •The Racial Justice Team assists the conference in offering racial diversity and cultural competency training, and the Congregational Vitality Team joined the Local Congregational Support Working Group to offer another training for lay leaders of congregations.
- •The Spiritual Development Team is celebrating the renewed energy they feel in re-engaging to produce youth programs after the pandemic curtailed their momentum for so long.
- •The Nominating Committee has recommended a slate of about 30 candidates to be voted in to serve on the PNEC Board, committees and teams at the Spring Conference Meeting in late April.
- The GEM Fund (Grants for Energizing Mission) approved a \$2,500 grant to Heidelberg Union church to upgrade their technology system.
- •The Spring Conference Meeting Planning Group has most details in place for the gathering to be held at St. Thomas Macada UCC in Bethlehem on Saturday, April 29th from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm. The theme is Health, Renewal and Restoration and you can attend by Zoom or in person as a guest for a \$20 registration fee, or as a LUCC delegate for \$35.

Updates from Board Sub-groups:

The Discernment and Visioning Team has offered three evening Zoom Lenten Bible Study sessions in March, which included discussion questions about what congregational members would like to see the Conference offer in the future.

The Alan Miller Memorial Task Force has proposed a fund to be established that will support some percentage of the cost of Pastors' sabbatical plans if they meet the parameters of being totally fun and relaxing to lift spirits, reconnect with family, nature, etc. This would mirror Alan's own view of the purpose of sabbatical time. The Board approved the concept and asked the group to continue developing details for the fund.


