From the Pastor Rev. Kimberly Berenotto

We've been spending a lot of time in the Longswamp UCC office preparing for summer - making schedules, creating fliers, updating the church website, etc. I was tempted to write, what I would consider, a classic June church newsletter article. It would go over the highlights of our summer and then encourage everyone to stay engaged with their faith over the upcoming warm and sunny months (seriously, please come to church this summer).

The Summer Day Who made the world? Who made the swan, and the black bear? Who made the grasshopper? This grasshopper, I mean the one who has flung herself out of the grass, the one who is eating sugar out of my hand, who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and downwho is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes. Now she lifts her pale forearms and thoroughly washes her face. Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away. I don't know exactly what a prayer is. I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass, how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields, which is what I have been doing all day. Tell me, what else should I have done? Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon? by Mary Oliver Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?

newsletter, checking in with what your pastor has to say, looking over the June scheduled activities – you don't need an impassioned newsletter article attempting to keep the momentum of worship and faith formation at our church chugging along throughout the summer. So, what do you need? Maybe I should ask some questions!

Jesus was known for questions – he asks 305 questions in the Gospels. Jesus' questions were often open-ended, and always curious. Jesus was eager to know more about the lives of his followers; seeking to better understand their beliefs, their hardships, and their desires. A few times Jesus just asked someone in-need, "What can I do for you?" Jesus didn't assume he knew people's stories and he took the time to ask genuine questions.

In fact, timing wasn't that important to Jesus. Jesus wasn't in a rush; he wasn't trying to push forward to the next location – these 305 questions were able to be asked and answered meaningfully because Jesus took the time for them. And none of Jesus' questions ever asked "When?"

We ask a lot of "When" questions. From simple questions like, "When will this person call me back?" to big ones like, "When will my loved one no longer be sick?"

Our society is very time-focused; there are whole industries built around how to manage one's time efficiently and expediting certain daily tasks to see how much we can cram into one 24-hour period. That's not how Jesus lived, though, and that's why he was able to be open and curious to the needs of so many people.

Perhaps, this summer, we can allow Jesus to lead us to the right questions. Questions focused on where we want to be in life. Questions about who we are as Christ's disciples. Questions about how we can help others and better serve God in our day-to-day life.

This might help us to take a step back from getting caught up in the schedule and the "Whens" of summer. And instead ask ourselves; what are we going to do with our one wild and precious life?





Leadership Updates



This month's article is a recap of the PNEC Spring Conference Meeting held on May 3rd at Neffs Union Church. Of course, the typical business items were on the agenda, such as:

- Accepting the minutes of the Fall Meeting in November, and the Team and Committee reports of activities undertaken in the past six months, plus the 2024 year-end financial reports highlighted by Treasurer Martin Nuscher.
- Many congregations were recognized for their financial support of OCWM and National Church Ministries, such as One Great Hour of Sharing and Neighbors in Need. Also, congregations which are Open and Affirming and/or WISE congregations were noted.
- About 20 pastors were recognized for the anniversaries of their ordination or licensing, ranging between 5 years and 60 years.

Based on the assumption the merger vote will pass; the following actions were also taken:

- Affirmation of individuals nominated to serve out the remaining terms on the PNEC Board, Staff and Personnel Committee, and the Nominating Committee through the end of 2025.
- Affirmation of the four individuals nominated to serve on a transitional Board for the Keystone Conference with terms ending in either two or three years.
- Several others were nominated to serve on the three sub-groups of the Committee on Ministry. This committee will remain in our Association after the Keystone vote, doing the work of supporting future pastors as they study for ordination, guiding and supporting them as they serve, and supporting local congregations in ways that will make them more vital, effective, and engaged in their communities. All these individuals nominated were also affirmed by the body.
- Delegates also approved 25 individuals, an equal number of clergy and laity, to attend the General Synod meeting in mid-July where the vote on the proposed consolidation of four PA Conferences will take place.
- All of the nominated volunteers listed above were installed by Bonnie Bates.
- Bonnie also introduced the proposed Constitution and By-Laws for the Keystone Conference, and the delegates affirmed them until after the Synod vote approving the new Conference. At that point, PNEC will hold the final approval vote on these documents at the Fall Conference meeting in November.

Upcoming events of interest were also announced, including an Open House at the Conference Office in Palmerton on Saturday, September 27th, the Fall PNEC Conference Meeting at St. John's UCC, Nazareth, on November 1st, and Bonnie's Retirement Party at the Northampton Community Center on November 16th.



Message from the Treasurer

Included in member giving for missions are \$165 for Our Church's Wider Mission, \$420 for Internal Missions (church steeple repairs, egg hunt) and \$880 for CWS blankets. Included in Other income is \$1,983.75 for the cell tower lease fee, \$2,600 for the Learning Center facility use fee, \$224 for the Sight and Sound trip and a \$431 premium rebate for worker's compensation. Included in Building Fund expenses are \$493 for cleaning services, \$849.40 for electric service, \$654 for the monthly heating oil budget payment, \$2,375 for plowing and salting of parking lots, \$862.02 for heating repairs and \$8,650 for steeple siding repairs (insurance reimbursed the church for most of the expense.)
