From the Pastor Rev. Kimberly Berenotto

I read a headline this past week stating: "Advent Calendars are Out of Control!" However, I'm not sure how critical I can be of the plethora of Advent calendars available for the general public. Let's be real, my dog, Dipper, has an Advent calendar.

Protestants in Germany in the 1800's began the tradition of counting down the days until Christmas by making chalk marks on walls and doors, lighting candles, or placing straw in the Nativity Scene each day to prepare a bed for Jesus (because you wouldn't put Jesus in your nativity scene until Christmas).

By the 1850's, this practice evolved into handmade wooden Advent calendars that included religious images for each day leading up to Christmas. The first printed Advent calendars were created in 1903 by German publisher Gerhard Lang. He produced Advent calendars on thick cardboard with little doors that opened to reveal religious illustrations and text. The calendar was inspired by a cardboard Advent calendar his mother had made for him when he was a child; however there are rumors his mother included cookies as well as religious teachings in his childhood Advent calendar!

In 1946, German printer, Richard Sellmar, picked up the mantle of Advent Calendar production - his first one featuring a bucolic and peaceful winter scene. Sellmar is responsible for international distribution of theses calendars too, and his work is what brought Advent calendars to the U.S.A.

The cardboard Advent calendars with little doors revealing religious teachings became the mainstay for counting down the days to Christmas. Until the 1970's, when Cadbury (in Great Britain) decided that only the most faithful folks were really benefiting from the Advent Calendar, and perhaps the less-churched crowd could use inspiration in the form of a chocolate a day. Things have taken off from there as you can now purchase Advent calendars filled with just about anything: Legos, jelly, alcohol, nail polish, cheese, coffee, soaps, science experiments, and MUCH more. Plus, you've got manufacturers claiming that any of these calendars, regardless of the season of the year or the amount of days, are "Advent" calendars. As if the word Advent just means countdown!

So maybe Advent Calendars ARE out of control. Regardless, what's most important is remembering what that Advent Countdown is for; marking the days we spend waiting for Jesus' arrival. Advent is not Christmas; it's a season of hope, of anticipation, of recognizing darkness as the light of Christ grows brighter and brighter until Christmas day.

Perhaps candles were the best way to mark those days, in recognition of the light that is coming to us. Or, perhaps, you feel the light of Christ grow most when you open that Advent calendar door to reveal a chocolate, some cheese, mascara, a Lego car.....I won't judge you! I'll be over here opening the little door each day in December to give my dog a treat. But, I'll also be remembering, it's Advent, not Christmas. A time to reflect, a time to hope, a time to embrace darkness in anticipation of what's to come.

Poinsettia Orders



Leadership Updates



I've been thinking about how to simplify all this talk of the new conference, the new association, transitional boards, transitional budgets, etc. It's a lot of change, especially for us at PNEC who have only heard about "the conference" for so many years. It came to me that the easiest way to outline what is happening is that... "all that used to be accomplished by the conference, and the support services they offered to our member churches" will now be divided and originate from either the state-wide, centralized Keystone Conference, or from the more local Mountain Valley Association. As a member church of each organization, we are being asked to send financial support to both entities like we have supported all those services through funding support of OCWM through PNEC.

It's logical to redirect our (former) OCWM gifts between Keystone Conference and Mountain Valley Association since the services available to us from PNEC in the past will now originate from one of the two separate entities. For church financial administrators, a remittance form is being developed for churches to simplify submitting to the two offices.

PNEC will accept funding for OCWM as usual for 2025 until it closes the books for the final year on January 15, 2026. After that, support for OCWM (and mission organizations such as Phoebe Ministries, Lancaster Theological Seminary, and Kids Peace) for 2026 should be directed to the Keystone Conference at P.O. Box 6625, Harrisburg, PA 17112.

Also, beginning on January 16th, funding for programmatic support for churches in our area (like Search and Call, Pastoral Support, Clergy and Lay Leadership Training, Candidates on the path to Ordination, and the Committee on Ministry) should go to Mountain Valley Association at 105 East 19th St. Northampton, PA 10867. This office space is donated by St. Paul's UCC church.

One more note, the Friends of the Conference Program which was developed for individual church members in PNEC interested in funding the work of the conference directly (without going through the OCWM route), will be renamed "Friends of the Mountain Valley Association" and that will still be an option to support the Association and the programs it offers congregations in our area directly.

Our Association will be overseen by an eight-person Board of Directors including the four officers (Moderator, Asst. Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer) and the chairs of the four Standing Committees (Committee on Ministry, Nominations Committee, Search and Call, and the Program Committee. The Board is supported by Rev. Dr. Nora Driver Faust of the Keystone Conference, who will be Mountain Valley's Transitional Regional Conference Minister for our area. We will also have the support of Paul Keller as our office administrator (a communication specialist, also a Keystone employee, who I believe will write the conference newsletter). And there will be one more part-time person who will primarily maintain databases for the Association.

IIncluded in member giving for missions are \$170 for Our Church's Wider Mission and \$878 for Friend, Inc. Included in Other income are \$1,159 for the barn dance, \$1,983.75 for the cell tower lease fee, \$2,600 for the Learning Center facility use fee and \$663 from the Food Sale.

Included in Building Fund expenses are \$785 for heating oil, \$950.01 for electric service, \$493 for cleaning services, \$890.99 for water testing, treatment, and equipment maintenance, \$465 for mowing and trimming, \$2,151 for the annual HVAC service contract and \$220.44 for the state boiler inspection fee.
