





# A Leadership Update

### **Conference News**

At the PNEC Board meeting in March, Rev. Karl Jones, Coordinator of Disaster Ministries for PNEC and PSEC, submitted a report indicating that, when the final numbers are tabulated, the High Five Campaign will have raised more than \$5,000 to aid those in the local area impacted by natural disasters. PNEC Treasurer, Rev. Martin Nuscher, also had good financial news to report, saying the accounting for the 2021 fiscal year finished strong with the total shortfall being less than \$4,000. He also mentioned that OCWM giving was 99% of the previous year, and 94% of the budget estimate. Total expenses for 2021 were almost 99% of the previous year. The 2/28/2022 income report also showed a strong start when compared to the same point in 2021, but it is too early in the year to make predictions.

The Nominating Committee Report also showed good progress, outlining a slate of over forty individuals to be presented for an approval vote at the Conference Business meeting on May 14, 2022. It was mentioned that the Committee continued to work on securing a few more nominations to fill vacancies on the Oversight Working Group and one Board Member's unexpired term, so the report may be amended before going to the delegates. In other related business concerning the Spring Conference Meeting, there was a call for Board members to fill slots for tellers to count votes from the delegates. Those positions were all filled.

And the last bit of Board business was to determine where to donate the offering from the worship service at the meeting. After several suggestions and discussion, the Board decided to divide the offering equally between the National Church setting for support of Ukrainian residents displaced by the war, and the Lehigh Conference of Churches because they are a model of the Conference Meeting Theme of ecumenical partnerships working jointly to further mission outreach and programs for those in need.

The Board of Directors retreat will be held the following weekend on May 21<sup>st</sup>, and the tentative agenda for that gathering was shared, including:

- A training/review of the Governance and Ministry system,
- A summary of PNEC accomplishments over the past year,
- Listening to the needs and suggestions of the Ministry Team Chairs in attendance,
- Formation of a meeting calendar through spring of 2023, and
- Strategic planning for Board actions for the upcoming year

The Discernment and Visioning Team held their first meeting where they reviewed and revised their purpose statement and shared the draft of a Memorandum of Commitment created by the four Conference Ministers within Pennsylvania. The memorandum states their intent to continue to seek ways to work as partners in unity to sustain their conferences and congregations. The Team also sent the memorandum and a survey out to all pastors in the four Conferences to verify what they need the most, having agreed to address congregational needs first. They will meet again in late March.

### Lots of learning and having fun!

All of the classrooms had lots of fun celebrating Easter with crafts, stories, special treats, and egg hunts!

The infants are growing and mastering gross motor skills each and every day! Our friends are learning how to sit up with and without support! They love to play and explore all the toys in the classroom!

The nursery classroom stayed busy learning all about ducks! They enjoyed exploring the duck sensory bags filled with rubber ducks and blue water! They had fun with Easter activities, filling paper Easter baskets with cut-out paper eggs, and sticking paper eggs and pom poms to sticky paper!

The toddler classroom celebrated National Farm Animal Day on April 11th! They used plastic forks to paint baby chicks and sang *Old MacDonald Had a Farm* as they looked at the book! They played matching games by matching pictures of baby farm animals to their mothers. They celebrated Easter by painting with Easter cookie cutters, playing with a bin filled with Easter grass and plastic rabbits and carrots, and having an Easter egg hunt!

cafeteria, and were so excited to ride the bus!

# Let's reach out to our food-insecure neighbors by helping the Brandywine Food Pantry!

Our local mission for May 2022 is the **Brandywine Food Pantry**. We will collect non-perishable food, personal care items, household and paper products for the local food pantry from Sunday, May 8, -Tuesday, May 31,

2022. LUCC is one of ten community churches and four civic organizations that support the Brandywine Food Pantry. This community outreach program, which is housed at St. Peter's UCC in Topton, is open to needy families/individuals in the Brandywine Heights Area School District. The pantry is open to area residents by appointment on the first three Tuesdays of the month and the third Thursday from 9:00AM to approximately 1:00PM. Please deposit your donations for the Brandywine Food Pantry in the appropriately marked boxes on the round table behind the piano in the front corner of the sanctuary or in the bell room. If you would rather give a monetary offering, please put it in your May mission envelope (dated May 15, 2022) and drop it in the offering basket during our Sunday morning worship service, in the locked offering box in the bell room (open during the week from 6:30AM - 5:30PM), or mail it to the church.

### Donated items "most needed" right now:

Breakfast - pancake syrup

<u>Lunch/Dinner</u> - chili, beef stew, Chef Boyardee type canned goods (beefaroni, ravioli, lasagna, etc.), Canned meat (tuna, chicken, Spam, Treet), Ramen noodles, salad dressings, spaghetti sauce (any) <u>Baking/Cooking products</u> - cooking oil, flour, sugar, evaporated milk

<u>Snacks</u> - chips, cookies, crackers, pretzels, pudding, etc.

<u>Drinks</u> - coffee, fruit juice (all kinds), hot cocoa mix

<u>Condiments</u> - ketchup, mayonnaise, mustard, peanut butter

<u>Personal hygiene products</u> - body wash, shampoo

<u>Household/ paper items</u> - dish soap, laundry detergent, paper towels, tissues, toilet tissue

#### The pantry can <u>always</u> use the following items:

Cereal (all kinds), oatmeal; Canned items such as ham salad, chicken and dumplings, diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, beets, creamed style corn etc.; Instant mashed potatoes or other potato products; Pickles and vinegar; Fruit juice (grape, cranberry, apple), tea; Rice-a-Roni, Pasta side dishes; All kinds of snacks (chips, energy bars, Pop-tarts, pretzels, etc.); Marshmallow fluff; Gluten-free and/or sugar-free items; Combs, hairbrushes, shampoo/conditioner

canned vegetables (corn, mixed vegetables), tomato soup

#### Notes from the Treasurer...

Included in member giving for missions are \$144 for Our Church's Wider Mission, \$115 for One Great Hour of Sharing and \$865 for High Five for Disaster Relief. Included in Other Income are the Learning Center facility use payment of \$2,245, \$1,983.75 for the cell tower lease and \$600 for use of the Schubert Haus by the Longswamp Township Historical Society. Included in Building Fund expenses are \$1,152.17 for cabinets in the church office, \$10,300 for the final payment on the new windows at the Schubert Haus, \$750 for cleaning services, \$320.50 for water testing and equipment maintenance, \$765 for the heating oil budget payment, \$1,090.16 for propane to heat the sanctuary and Boy Scout cabins, \$1,570.04 for electric service for 2 months and \$582.80 servicing/repairs of emergency lighting and fire alarm system.
